Christmas Tree Recycling Opportunities

El Dorado Disposal does not service on Christmas Day or New Years Day, customers serviced on those days and everyday after that week will be delayed by one day.

Between January 2nd – January 15th you can drop off your natural Christmas tree for free recycling at the Material Recovery Facility (MRF), located at 4100 Throwita Way, Placerville. Tree must be free of tinsel, lights or ornaments. Flocked trees are not recyclable, they will be charged as trash. The MRF is open daily from 8am to 5pm.

If you have curbside service between January 2^{nd} – January 31^{st} , natural Christmas trees will be picked up from the curb during your <u>vard waste</u> collection week. If you do not have yard waste

collection in your area we will pick up the Christmas trees on your trash only collection weeks. Please cut the tree into pieces and bundle the pieces with twine or rope. Bundles can not be more than 3 feet long and 18 inches in diameter. Place bundles on the ground next to your cart.

Residents of El Dorado Hills may drop off natural Christmas trees on January 4th from 9am to 3pm at the Rolling Hills Church located at 800 White Rock Rd, El Dorado Hills for the tree chipping event. Trees must be free of tinsel, lights & ornaments. Flocked trees are not acceptable.

Residents of Cameron Park CSD may drop off natural Christmas trees from January 3rd – January 5th at Cameron Park Lake lower parking lot, located at 2989 Cambridge Road from 7am – dusk. Cameron Park Boy Scout Troops 700 and 550 collect Christmas

trees for recycling to help pay for scout camps, events & outings. Suggested Donation is \$10.00. Envelopes will be dropped off at eligible homes on December 8th. Due to safety issues Scouts may not be able to reach all homes. Tree pick up will take place on January 4th starting at 8am. Trees must be free of tinsel, lights & ornaments. Flocked trees are not acceptable.
